The KBB Music Festival is the largest regional youth music event in New Zealand involving over 4,000 young musicians. It showcases Symphony Orchestras, Chamber Orchestras, Concert Bands and Jazz Bands in Auckland secondary schools and beyond. Formerly known as the Auckland Secondary Schools Band and Orchestra Festival, the Festival began in 1983 with a few schools combining for performances and has since grown in both size and stature.

In 2019, 143 groups representing 50 schools from the greater Auckland region will perform at the Holy Trinity Cathedral for awards and a place in the prestigious Gala Concerts.

The aims of the Festival are:

To promote growth in instrumental music and encourage performance by all groups – novice or highly experienced

To share ideas, techniques and a common interest in music

To expose students to different styles of music

To give students the opportunity to perform in professional venues





FESTIVAL CHAIRPERSON'S WELCOME

KBB Music Festival 2019

On behalf of the Festival Committee I extend a warm welcome to all the performers, their teachers and members of the audience for the 36th annual KBB Music Festival. I hope all the performers will thoroughly enjoy their experience of making music and listening to other performers at the Festival. Everyone is in for some special musical experiences as they listen to around 4,000 musically talented secondary school performers participating in this festival which runs from Monday 12th to Saturday 17th August.

This is my ninth year as Chairperson of the Festival and I wish to thank the staff at the Holy Trinity Cathedral and the adjoining St Mary's Church for their ongoing support. Over the past few years, audiences and performers at the Festival have witnessed the gradual evolution of the HTC facilities and in 2018 performances in the Cathedral benefitted from Cathedral support staff and, following renovations and additions, the pleasure of performing in the recently consecrated Cathedral. I have no doubt 2019 will offer similar experiences.

This year we once again have a selection of experienced adjudicators. **Michael Joel** (NZ/London) and **Ronan**

Tighe (Auckland) are the adjudicators for the Symphony Orchestra category; Shelley Wilkinson (Wellington) and Ashley Brown (Auckland) will adjudicate the Chamber Orchestras; Concert Bands are adjudicated by Alison Housley (Sydney) and Beth Cohen (Christchurch); and jazz artists Ron Samson (University of Auckland) and Olivier Holland (University of Auckland) are adjudicating the Jazz Bands.

On the afternoon of Friday 16th August, from 5pm – 8.00pm, students will have an opportunity to work either with **David Kay** in the **Honours Symphony Orchestra** or with **Roger Manins** in the **Honours Jazz Band.** This is a fantastic opportunity for students from various schools to play with peers from other schools and also to work with either of our two highly respected musical directors. Each group will undertake an intensive rehearsal of some great repertoire (see page 29), followed by a free performance for parents, teachers and public 8:30 to 9.00pm pm in the Holy Trinity Cathedral. All welcome.

The 2019 **Gala Concerts** will be held at the Holy Trinity Cathedral on **Saturday** 17th **August.** Chamber Orchestras and Concert Bands will be performing at 2:00pm and Symphony Orchestras and Jazz Bands at 6.30pm.

The awards for this year will be: Gold, Silver, Bronze and Commended; Best Performance of a New Zealand Work Awards as well as 3 further KBB Music Best Performance awards added in 2017 for specific repertoire types in each category (see page 7 for further information); and the Tour Time Outstanding Soloist Awards for performances of works featuring soloists in Symphony & Chamber Orchestras and Concert Bands as well as the Tour Time Jazz Improvisation Award for the highest standard of improvisation across a Jazz Band programme. The Chairperson's Command Performance Award, will be presented to a group from a school not already represented at either Gala Concert, which the Chairperson and adjudicators believe has added something unique to the Festival. The Peter Goddard Memorial Award, will be presented to an ensemble, selected by the committee, whose performance, presentation or behaviour at the Festival embodies the values that Peter Goddard held with regard to the attitude and disposition of a musician.

The Festival would very much like to thank Tour Time, in particular Brent & Sandra Imrie, for sponsoring the Outstanding Soloist Awards in addition to the Jazz Improvisation Award that was instigated in 2015, and their ongoing generous support of the festival and its participants.

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Gold (85 – 100%)

The ensemble has presented a programme which is delivered with exceptional accuracy and fluency, secure and superior technical skills, consistent balance and sensitive musicianship, and effective and convincing presentation skills.

The performance fully engages the audience. The adjudicators are in no doubt that this ensemble is performing at a level beyond that which is expected of a secondary school ensemble of this type.

Overall this is an outstanding performance

Silver (75 – 84%)

The ensemble has presented a programme which shows secure technical skills, a high degree of accuracy, balance between parts, musicianship, and presentation skills.

The performance engages the audience. The adjudicators agree that the group has performed to a very high standard, but has not quite attained the level professionalism of groups in the Gold category.

Overall this is a convincing performance

Bronze (60 – 74%)

The ensemble has presented a programme which, overall, shows a very good level of accuracy, balance and musicality, and a high standard of presentation.

The performance mostly engages the audience. The adjudicators agree that while the ensemble plays with noteworthy strengths, these are tempered by some areas of weakness.

Overall this is an effective performance

Commended Award

The ensemble has presented a programme which has many noteworthy positive elements, some technical skills, accuracy, balance, musicianship and presentation skills.

Though the programme has several areas in which further development is needed, the adjudicators wish to commend the ensemble for a particular performance aspect or specific item.

Participation

The ensemble has presented a programme which may have many noteworthy positive elements, some technical skills, accuracy, balance musicianship and presentation skills.

The programme has several areas in which further development is needed. The performance may have too many inaccuracies, instrumentation issues or technical problems and the adjudicators agree that the group is not ready to be acknowledged with an award at this time.

The group will be invited to perform this work at one of the Gala Concerts. The group will be selected from a school not already represented at the Gala Concerts.

Peter Goddard Memorial Award

The ensemble receiving the Peter Goddard Memorial Award will be chosen by the Chairperson of the KBB Music Festival Committee having received nominations from committee members. This award is endowed by the KBB Music Festival in recognition of the support given

by Peter Goddard during his life time to the development of young musicians. The award, which will be announced at the Gala Concerts, will be presented to an ensemble whose performance, presentation or behaviour embodies the values that Peter Goddard held.



ASHLEY BROWN

Chamber Orchestras



In his student years, Ashley won the Young Musicians Competition, National Concerto Competition and Young Achievers Award plus prizes at the Adam International Cello Competition, Gisborne International Music Competition and the ROSL Music Competition in London. His academic history includes the Master of Music (Canterbury), Artist Diploma (Yale) and Doctor of Musical Arts (Auckland), plus cello lecturer positions at the universities of Waikato, Canterbury and Auckland. He was a member of the Turnovsky Trio and Principal Cellist of the Auckland Philharmonia. In 2002 he formed NZTrio with Justine Cormack and

Sarah Watkins and this year welcomed new permanent members Amalia Hall and Somi Kim, to take NZTrio into a new era. The trio is a strong exponent of new art music from New Zealand and overseas as well as the masterpieces of the Piano Trio repertoire and genre-busting collaborations. Ashley continues to be a driving force in NZTrio, performing around the country and overseas, yet he still keeps a busy schedule of solo and ensemble recitals, concertos and recording and enjoys close collaborative relationships with artists from across the spectrum of genres. He plays the 1762 William Forster "Liberte" cello.

MICHAEL JOEL

Symphony Orchestras



New Zealand-born conductor, Michael Joel studied at Otago University where he completed an Honours degree in conducting. After graduating he studied with conductors Heinz Wallberg, Miguel Harth-Bedoya, Jac van Steen, and at the Dartington International Summer School.

Equally at home in the orchestral, choral and operatic repertoire, Michael has conducted extensively throughout New Zealand and, since relocating to London in 2014, at The Royal Opera House, assisting Antonio Pappano, Bertrand de Billy, and Marc Minkowski.

He has conducted many of the established orchestras and companies in New Zealand - Christchurch Symphony Orchestra, the Southern Sinfonia, St Matthew's Chamber Orchestra, Opera Otago, the City of Dunedin Choir, NZSO National

Youth Orchestra and members of the NZSO and NZ String Quartet in a chamber version of Mahler's 4th Symphony.

Michael was Music and Development Officer, Chorus Master and Assistant Conductor at Canterbury Opera. During his tenure he conducted Lakmé, Rusalka, Comte Ory, La traviata and the world premiere of Jonathan Besser's "work in progress". In 2006 he conducted a highly successful production of Die Fledermaus for Opera Hawke's Bay.

Michael is currently Music Director of St Matthew's Chamber Orchestra and has recently freelanced with the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden as duty conductor on productions of *Carmen*, *Tosca, La Bohème, La Traviata, Don Carlo* and *Otello*. Michael is also an accomplished violist and teacher, working in London.

Shelley has balanced her professional life between being a performer (playing in the Australian Baroque Orchestra in Sydney for over 10 years and as a member of several chamber groups touring for CMNZ), adjudicator (for CMNZ School Music Contests, various district competitions & scholarships and KBB Festivals for Auckland's secondary school orchestras), chamber music tutor/coach and radio Producer for RNZ Concert.

But it's the teaching work that has been the most important and rewarding part of her career. Whilst in Auckland over the past decade Shelley taught violin at several secondary schools. Prior to that she had a well-established studio in Wellington and Nelson.

Shelley has recently re-established her private studio back in Wellington, teaching violin and viola. She teaches violin at Queen Margaret College and 2019 also finds Shelley as the interim violin teacher for Arohanui Strings - Sistema Hutt Valley, an inspiring music programme which is part of a visionary, and now global, movement aiming to transform the lives of children through music.

SHELLEY WILKINSON

Chamber Orchestras



Ronan Tighe is Director of Artistic Planning at the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra, a position he's held since 2010. He takes charge of the orchestra's concert programming including selecting guest conductors and soloists as well as repertoire and scheduling. Prior to this he spent 6 years as an agent for some of the world's leading conductors and soloists at the London office of one of the industry's most significant classical music agencies,

IMG Artists, which involved managing the careers of artists such as Itzhak Perlman, Simon Trpceski, Yan Pascal Tortelier and others. He has also worked with the D'Oyly Carte Opera Company in London and the Irish Baroque Orchestra in Dublin. He trained as a clarinettist and worked for some years as a freelance musician and teacher in Ireland before making the change to a career in Arts Management.

Concert Bands



Alison Housley is a prominent music educator based in Sydney. She is a Kiwi whose passion for the concert band genre came early, when she was a flautist in California high school bands.

Alison trained in music education at the University of Auckland and has studied conducting, piano, flute and trombone. She was Head of Music at several Auckland high schools before moving to Sydney in 2007. She is currently Director of Music at International Grammar School (IGS). Alison has actively supported concert band development in New Zealand and Australia. She is a past president of the NZCBA and promoted the development of their annual festival to include overseas adjudicators, educational programmes, workshops and overseas ensemble performances. Alison also initiated the NZ Secondary Schools Jazz Festival. In Sydney she is

actively involved with the NSW branch of the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association (ABODA), working to create major educational events for students, teachers and ensembles across Australia. Alison's driving philosophy is that all students should engage with performance music and have the opportunity to participate in an ensemble.

In her program at IGS, all junior students enter an instrumental program of weekly tutorials and band rehearsals. The band repertoire reinforces the classroom music curriculum and is taught through the Orff Schulwerk approach, which Alison strongly advocates. This method develops the innate aural skills of students and leads to a rapid acquisition of musicianship while nurturing the love of playing music with others.

RON SAMSON

Jazz Bands



Ron Samsom began lecturing at the University of Auckland in 2003 and has coordinated the jazz studies programme since 2006. His current teaching portfolio includes: jazz history, Honours composition, percussion ensemble, small ensembles, drum set instruction and Postgraduate supervision. Ron is an active performer, composer and researcher in the area of improvised music and his work features on many local and international recordings. Prior to moving to New Zealand, Ron's career began in Canada after completing a Diploma in Music at Grant MacEwan College, a BMus from St Francis Xavier and an MMus from McGill University. Ron's unique

approach to performing has made him highly regarded in the musical communities here and abroad. With many ongoing collaborations and projects such as the "Samsom Nacey Haines Trio", DOG" and "Neutrino Funk", Ron has established a strong publishing relationship with Rattle records and shares a similar goal of producing a rich tapestry of improvised music featuring New Zealand based musicians. Recent performances with visiting international artists include: Marc Isaacs (AUS), Benny Lackner (GER), Mike Nock (AUS), Barney McAll (USA), Chris Cody (FRA), James Muller (AUS) Jef Nev (BELGIUM), David Berkman ((USA)

Beth Cohen graduated in music from Bradeis University and earned a master's degree in orchestral conducting from the University of Wisconsin (USA). She worked for over 30 years throughout the New York metropolitan area where she gained a reputation as an enthusiastic, energetic, and dedicated educator and conductor. Beth made her Carnegie Hall debut with the Manhattan Philharmonic and subsequently conducted the New American Chamber Orchestra, the InterSchools Orchestras of New York and the Stevens University Orchestra.

Since emigrating to New Zealand Beth has conducted the Christchurch School of Music's Camerata Strings and ISO Orchestras, the Canterbury Regional Schools Orchestra, the Garden City Orchestra, Auckland's Victorious March Concert Band, the Resonance Orchestra, and the Auckland Philharmonic Outreach Orchestra.

In 2020 Beth will be guest conducting the Dunedin Youth Orchestra and Christchurch School of Music Sinfonia Orchestra. Beth is currently working on her PhD through the University of Canterbury titled "Updating the Bernstein model: Engaging new audiences with classical music"

BETH COHEN

Concert Bands



Olivier is a bassist, composer/arranger and educator based in Auckland, New Zealand. His long career has seen him perform and record with top artists from all over the world. Olivier is in the process of writing his very own double bass teaching method book after obtaining expressions of interest from Sher Music (USA) as well as Bassline Publishing (UK). He has completed a bass-doctorate in 2017 and currently teaches at the University of Auckland Jazz Department in a variety of subjects.

(Dr.) Oli is passionate about the bass, so passionate indeed that he now writes his own double bass teaching method, due in 2020. He loves grooving / swinging / playing behind other artists and is passionate about the tone of the instrument as well as time and

accentuation. His chops and agility allow him to 'solo' and walk freely across the neck, a skill that he has refined in the last 8 years, with his method of personalizing playing technique. The latter he has developed as part of his doctoral studies and will form the basis for his upcoming teaching method.

Besides playing it, Oli also has a passion for teaching and researching the bass, then sharing his findings with students and fellow bassists. In this instance he has published an article in "Bass World" in 2016, as well as lectured/performed at the 2017 ISB Bass Convention in Ithaca, New York. Further bass related insights and secrets will be aired in a feature interview in the German magazine "Der Bassprofessor" in mid 2019. Stay tuned!
